Changes are coming to the Glen Carbon Library. We are beginning a shifting project that will be moving several collections around. The first is that we are integrating the Young Adult Nonfiction into the Adult Nonfiction Collection. This will give the Young Adult section more room for the growing displays and for the Young Adult Fiction collection. The Adult Fiction section will be rearranged to have five shelves and we will be integrating the Paperback Fiction into those shelves. We will also be moving the Adult Music CDs to all be on one side of the shelf. Once those two collections are moved, we will be taking the Juvenile DVDs and moving them to be on the shelves that had held Paperbacks and CDs. If you can't find something, please check with any member of the staff and we will help you locate any items.

We are also starting a furniture project to replace the upholstery on some of our study table chairs that have begun to look worn. We will be needing to substitute some plastic chairs during this time, These may not be comfortable, but we hope everyone will appreciate the new-looking chairs, once they've been returned.

Demonstrating best practices for using these tools falls to parents, caregivers, and teachers who all understand that the best Face Time is looking into a child's face and sharing precious moments before they grow up and away.
